- Complete Risk Assessments for each application and project

The Elgin Area Convention & Visitors Bureau and the Aurora Area Convention & Visitors Bureau will market tourism in Kane County by:

- Placing digital and print ads that will target drive markets already used by the Elgin Area Convention & Visitors Bureau, the Aurora Area Convention & Visitors Bureau, and Illinois Office of Tourism.
- Target leisure markets will primarily include Chicago/Metro, Iowa/Quad Cities, Indiana/Indianapolis and Wisconsin/Southern with the greater Midwest region included based on messaging and relevancy.
- Ads will focus on niches relevant to Kane County/Elgin/Aurora Area: Fabulous Fox! Water Trail, Outdoor Recreation, Sports Tournaments, <u>Agritourism</u>, Weekend Getaways for Families and Food Trails to promote small businesses.
- Digital ads will run through Datafy, Google or Social Media
- Print ads can be in Midwest Living Magazine, AAA Living, Illinois Travel Guide or other
- print magazines that make sense for attracting overnight visitors.

Project Overview Farm Business Resiliency Project – The Conservation Fund

Project Goal:

Build local food system resilience through targeted assistance for Kane County Farmers in response to pandemic-related economic volatility and supply chain disruptions.

Context:

While the demand for fresh, local foods remains high, farm businesses continue to struggle with persistent challenges including access to land, capital, and technical assistance. COVID-19 compounded existing market vulnerabilities for farmers, especially those operating in peri-urban areas



Program Functions



Competitive Grants Program

A competitive grants program for Kane County based producers to cover farm infrastructure improvements / upgrades, equipment, and other costs related to farm business viability



Working Farms Fund Expansion

Directed financial assistance to expand Working Farms Fund program services for Kane County Farmers including:

- Program operations (staff time)
- Real estate due diligence costs
- On-farm infrastructure (for farmers enrolled in the WFF program)

The Working Farms Fund

How it Works

1


The Conservation Fund acquires farmland at risk of development in metro areas (active projects in Chicago and Atlanta metro areas)

2

The purchased land is matched with next generation farmers who enter a lease-to-own arrangement 3 to 5 years

3

Farmer has option to purchase the land at reduced cost resulting from the application of a permanent agriculture conservation easement



Program Outcomes

- At least 50 Kane County farmers will be engaged through the project with offers of assistance for project development and planning, and creation and submission of grant proposals.
- \$1,000,000 in financial assistance will be awarded to farmers eligible applicants for eligible projects that will improve farm production capabilities and resiliency.
- At least 150 acres of Kane County farmland is made available for Kane County farmers to expand food production through the Working Farms Fund.
- An additional \$2M is leveraged through the Working Farms Fund program to benefit farmers in Kane County.

About the Conservation Fund

APPROVING SIX APPLICANTS FOR PROTECTION THROUGH THE KANE COUNTY FARMLAND PROTECTION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, Ordinance 01-67 Adopting and Implementing the Kane County Agricultural Conservation Easement and Farmland Protection Program was passed by the Kane County board on April 10, 2001; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 01-67 authorizes the board to acquire conservation interest in real property for the purpose of rural and farmland protection; and

WHEREAS, the Kane County Agricultural Conservation Easement and Farmland Protection Commission met on September 25, 2023 and recommends to the Kane County Board the following farms for land protection: Schoger Ag, LLC (2 farms), Carl and Amy Schoger, Souders Farm, Maddox Farm, Hermann Farm, Lucas Strom / Geneva Bank and Trust Farm.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Kane County Board approves the six applicants listed for farmland protection as local and federal funding is available and approved by the Kane County Board.
