





PROCLAMATION DECLARING KANE COUNTY'S SUPPORT FOR NATIONAL AGRICULTURE DAY

2025 Proclamation Declaring Kane County's Support for National Agriculture Day

WHEREAS, agriculture in Kane County contributes \$284 million in annual sales to the local economy, including crops and livestock products; and

WHEREAS, Kane County accounts for 509 working farms operating on 146,717 acres of land; and

WHEREAS, small to mid-sized farms constitute a large share of the county's working farmland, with farms of 49 acres or less accounting for 50% of agricultural operations; and

WHEREAS, active farms can be found in rural, suburban, and urbanized areas of the county, representing a diverse cross-section of the agricultural sector including equine activities, commodity crop, livestock, fruit, vegetable, floriculture, apiculture (beekeeping), and dairy production; and

WHEREAS, nearly one in five of the county's farms stable horses, with Kane County ranking 9th in the State of Illinois by horse population out of 102 counties; and

WHEREAS, the county's agritourism farms provide programs and experiences that educate residents on the source of their foods, seasonal entertainment and special event venues, and additional lines of income for farm businesses; and

WHEREAS, Kane County is home to numerous legacy family farms with 15 centennial farms and 30 sesquicentennial farms; and

WHEREAS, we value the contributions of our farmers as stewards of the land and providers of fresh and healthy foods for our residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Kane County Board does hereby proclaim Kane County's support for National Agriculture Day on Tuesday, March 18th, 2025. Kane County residents are invited to celebrate the tireless work of our farmers who contribute substantially to the historic character and wellbeing of our communities.
