Recap

The Kane County Board authorized and extended a service agreement with New Venture Advisors (NVA) to provide strategic guidance in addressing local food system needs and identify opportunities for growing successful agricultural businesses (Resolutions: No. 24-049 & 25-036).



Overview of Projects

Soil Health Impact & Economic Assessment

Purpose: An assessment of the economic, environmental, and public health benefits derived from adopting on-farm soil health management systems.

<u>Timeline</u>: Project launch recommended within the near term

<u>Project Cost</u>: \$113,700



Local Food Access Models & Strategies

Purpose: An analysis of ongoing initiatives focused on increasing the availability of local foods within the region.

<u>Timeline</u>: Project launch recommended later this year or at the conclusion of the Soil Health Assessment.

<u>Project Cost</u>: \$110,100



Funding

- Funding for both projects are in the 2025 budget using available funds from Fund 400
 Economic Development and Fund 430 - Farmland Preservation.
- Both Fund 400 and Fund 430 receive annual allocations from Internal Riverboat funds.

- The Soil Health Project was specifically included in the 2025 application for Internal Riverboat Funds for Fund 430 - Farmland Preservation
- The Local Food Access Models & Strategies project was discussed by the Agriculture Committee in 2024, and funds are available in Fund 400 - Economic Development.
- Staff is continuing to look for other funding sources for the Local Food Access Models & Strategies project, which is one of the reasons we are recommending a launch later this year.



Local Food Access Models & Strategies

Recommended for future launch

Context / Need

Kane County explored the feasibility of launching a food hub in 2015-17 and staff has received direction to explore new models and strategies for increasing local food production and access.

Kane County witnessed a decline in specialty crop acreage between 2017 and 2022 (US Census of Agriculture).

Intended Outcomes

- Generate an index of active food system programs and organizations aligned with Growing for Kane objectives
- Provide analysis of consumer sentiment and wholesale purchasing trends
- Obtain feedback and direction from local farmers
- Develop recommended program / project actions to be taken by Kane County



Soil Health Impact & Economic Assessment

Recommended for near-term launch

Context / Need

Farm businesses face continued challenges including the sharp rise of input costs and risks of extreme weather events.

Emerging research suggests the adoption of soil health practices may support farm production resilience and profitability.

Intended Outcomes

- Assess the current state of soil health and composition on select Kane Count farms
- ➤ Provide a business cost/benefit analysis associated with the adoption of soil health practices (modeling based on 2-3 Kane Co. farms)
- Determine the level of economic and public health benefits linked to adoption of soil health practices



Soil Health Impact & Economic Assessment

What are soil health management systems?

- Examples:
 - Cover cropping
 - No-till agriculture
 - Crop rotation
 - Livestock integration

Benefits to Kane County Farmers
