REPORTS

22 reports were taken from 205 dispatched calls for service.

CITATIONS & WARNINGS ISSUED

33 total citations written: 21 ordinance violations, 11 written warnings, and 1 state citation.

REPORT HIGHLIGHT SYNOPSIS

Assist Citizen

While on routine patrol at Fabyan FP, an officer noticed a juvenile had fallen off his scooter and suffered some road rash. The officer administered basic first aid to the juvenile's arm, knee, and face.

Damage to Property

The FPDKC North Ops Supervisor requested a TX from an officer to report damage to property. The North Ops Supervisor found damage on two (2) bathroom doors at the Carpenter's Dam. The damage appears to have been done by a baseball bat. No offender information at this time.

Graffiti

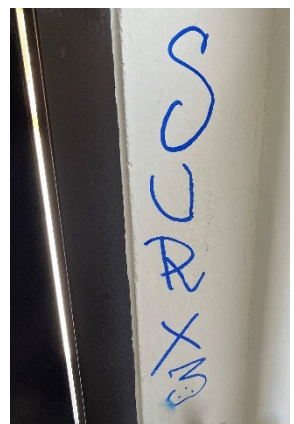
An officer spoke with a FPDKC Ranger via TX who reported finding blue marker graffiti on the restroom wall at the Raging Buffalo FP. The graffiti appears to be SUR 13 gang graffiti. To be noted, there was a similar incident with the same graffiti and same blue mark last month at Tyler Creek FP. No offender information at this time.

While on patrol at Voyageurs FP, a FPDKC employee notified an officer that they had found graffiti in the washroom. No offender information at this time.

Animal Complaint

The complainant/victim wanted a TX from an officer in regards to being bitten by a dog at the Schweitzer Woods Dog Park. Complainant advised that her dog was playing with a larger golden-colored dog when both dogs became aggressive toward one another and began fighting. The complainant attempted to separate the dogs by pulling her dog away from the larger golden dog. During this process, she was bitten on her right hand by the larger golden dog. The complainant returned to her vehicle to retrieve her phone to call 911 and advised that during that time the offending dog owner and dog left the park. The dog owner is described as an Asian female approximately 40-years-old with black hair. The dog is described as a large golden-colored dog weighing approximately 80 pounds with floppy ears. The complainant was advised to seek medical treatment for her injuries. By the time the responding officer made it to the dog park, no witnesses were able to be located. At this time, the identity of the dog owner and dog responsible for the bite remain unknown.

The complainant wanted a TX from an officer in regards to her two dogs being bitten by another dog at the Riverbend Dog Park. As the complaint approached the dog park with her two dogs, she noticed a female holding a 2-year-old with a dog in the fenced in area. The female subject



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advised that her dog was not very nice with other dogs and would exit the dog park. As she exited the dog park her dog began to pull on the leash and attacked the complainant's two dogs. The female advised that the dog belonged to her dad and provided his contact information. The complainant brought her dogs to the vet which were determined to be in stable condition. Contact was made with the dog owner who advised he would cover any vet bills.

Ordinance Violation

In early June, it was brought to the attention of the FPDKC Public Safety Department that several homeless people had taken up residence along the Fox River Trail. The FPDKC coordinated efforts with Elgin PD to post several pre-printed warnings to the transients that they must vacate the area by 06/11/2026 at 1100 hours. On that day, FPDKC officers, North Ops Rangers, and EPD officers responded to clear the entire area of refuse. While on scene, three (3) one-ton dump trucks were filled with refuse and abandoned belongings.

An officer was dispatched to Paul Wolff Campground for a camper who had three dogs running loose and was ignoring requests to catch the dogs. The responding officer made contact with the camper who apologized and quickly gathered up his dogs. It was agreed that instead of receiving ordinance violation citations that the camper would leave the property by noon.

Illegal Dumping

While on patrol at Ferson Creek FP, an officer discovered that an unknown offender dumped furniture, and a large leather recliner in the preserve. The furniture was too large for immediate removal. North Ops Supervisor was notified.

DUI Alcohol

An officer was dispatched to the Hughes Creek Golf Course for a vehicle versus golf cart accident. Two witnesses had observed a Hispanic female driving a gray SUV strike a parked golf cart. The Hispanic female was stumbling while standing and her speech was slurred. Field sobriety tests were administered and the female subject did not pass. The female subject was placed under arrest for Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol, transported to Kane County Jail for processing, and released with a future court date.

Theft

On 06/11/2026 the FPDKC was notified via voicemail by ComEd that the electrical meter to the Raymond Street FP pedestrian tunnel has been tampered with and/or damaged. On 06/12/2026, a North Ops Ranger responded to the area to access the damage and take photographs. The damage/theft of copper wiring is estimated to cost \$800 USD to repair/replace. No offender information at this time.

Death Investigation

On June 1, 2026 the Aurora Police Department (APD) found a deceased body in the retention ponds near the Chicago Premium Outlet Mall. These retention ponds are FPDKC property. APD advised that the deceased was the same female subject from their missing persons case reported on May 28, 2026 and that they were handling both investigations.



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Domestic Battery

An officer was dispatched to the Paul Wolff Campground for the report of a physical domestic in progress. A third-party complainant advised that she witnessed a male subject push a female subject down to the ground and was now chasing her. While the responding officer was in route, a KCSO deputy arrived on scene and advised that he had the male subject detained. With the assistance of a Language Line who translated Mongolian to English, the responding officer spoke to both the male offender and female victim. Both parties said that they were verbally arguing, but that there was no physical fighting between them. The KCSO deputy reported that he observed the male subject chase the female subject and shove her into the car. The male subject was arrested for Domestic Battery and transported to Kane County Jail for processing.
